- In January, a CoMobility seminar was held for the City Council. Warsaw, during which we presented and discussed the first results of the design study. It is two years since the official start of the collaboration with the City Council and the CoMobility research team. - We have completed another phase of qualitative research. You can read about the interviews conducted by Katarzyna Archnowicz-Kudelska <u>here</u>.
- The studies of changes to the Traffic Organisation in the surroundings of all three project schools are ready to be submitted to the relevant decision–makers for possible implementation.
- An in-depth evaluation report of the urban lab activities was presented to the project team, and its recommendations will enrich further school activities this school year.
- CitiesAl a leader in pedestrian mobility data has become a new collaborator in the CoMobility project. For more information, follow this link link.
- The leaders of the individual WPs are working on an annual content report on the project work and an updated publication plan.
- In WP6, modelling of air quality data around schools is nearing completion. The completion of this phase will be the route to new possibilities for analysis, linking transport choices to air pollution.
- A meeting of the entire consortium will take place in March. This time, the Warsaw School of Economics organises it.
- Plans for the next few months:
 - Much of the research work in the project is already being completed. The final tranches
 of survey data collection are planned for the coming months. Our team sees each other
 regularly during working meetings in smaller sub-groups and presents the results at
 seminars. The work aims to prepare scientific articles for publication.





- We have started work to make the data and results of the project publicly available. The data is currently being anonymised. Broader availability is planned for the summer of 2023.
- The winter period is a break in school interventions. Transport and awareness-raising interventions on how to look after children travelling to school will return in the spring.

CoMobility benefits from EUR 2.05 million received from Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway under the EEA funds. The project aims to provide a package of tools and methods to co-create sustainable mobility in urban areas.
