- The project's annual report has been finalised, and the CoMobility team is preparing the results for the annual meeting to be held on the campus of the Warsaw School of Economics.
- The first results of the modelling of survey data are being collected in the form of scientific publications. Work is underway on another survey, for which we have invited the Office of the Capital City of Warsaw to collaborate. Warsaw. We hope the collaboration will inspire us to raise essential questions from the city's transport policy perspective.
- We have received the first readings from the passive sensors of NO₂. We are collecting further data using this method to validate measurements from Airly's low-cost sensors.
- Plans for the next few months:
 - In March (15-16.03.2023), the consortium will meet again to take stock of the work done so far and set directions for further activities. This time, we meet in Warsaw, and the main organiser is Dr Jakub Zawieska from the Warsaw School of Economics.
 - We have started work to make the data and results of the project publicly available. The data is currently being anonymised. Broader availability is planned for the summer of 2023.

CoMobility benefits from EUR 2.05 million received from Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway under the EEA funds. The project aims to provide a package of tools and methods to co-create sustainable mobility in urban areas.
