

## CoMobility - Newsletter 16

### May 2023

- The CoMobility project has been nominated in the [‘Polish Smart Growth Award’](#) competition. The results will be announced during the [Smart Growth Forum 2023](#) Uniejów in October 2023. We are keeping our fingers crossed for the success of our team!
- A monitoring visit of the IdeaLab took place in May. The meeting with external experts helped plan the detailed tasks for the final year of the project.
- The final interventions in schools and the work to summarise them as recommendations for citizen science is ongoing.
- We have started collecting the latest round of data on the transport preferences of Warsaw residents. This time, the experimental part is about shared mobility. More information [here](#).
- Discussions are underway about the latest transport simulations in Warsaw.

- Plans for the next few months:
  - A series of meetings in the ‘Round Table’ form where students and officials participating in the urban labs exchange knowledge and experiences gathered during the co-creation and implementation of interventions in the project school setting, is planned for June 2023.
  - Less-numerous teams are working on further scientific publications and preparations for the summer conference season, during which team members will share their research findings with the scientific community.
  - We have started work to make the data and results of the project publicly available. The data is currently being anonymised. A wider release is planned for spring 2024.
  - *Save the Date!* The fourth edition of the ‘Workshops for Local Governments’ will take place on 14 September 2023 in Kraków. The meeting is planned as a hybrid, with stationary participants from Kraków. We would like to thank the Kraków University of Technology for providing the hall for this event.
  - A meeting of the entire consortium, which will last until 15 September 2023, will also begin in Kraków on the same day.
