

CoMobility - Newsletter 4

- On our new channel [YouTube](#), you can now watch up to four new videos from the series 'Science for People.' We have produced a report on the field research carried out by the 'On-Site' Foundation at Primary School No. 377 in Warsaw, and three tutorials showing how pupils can conduct their own research. Class 2b, taught by Ms Agnieszka Biernacka, actively participated in urban laboratories, learning about, measuring and researching transport behaviour and the environment around the school. We would like to thank the students and Educators for participating in the urban labs and creating the materials, and we warmly encourage you to watch the videos. We would also like to thank the team without whom the creation of the films would not have been possible – Maciej Eichelberger, Magda Bojdo, Łukasz Kamiński and Karolina Witowska, as well as our indispensable team from the 'On-Site' Foundation: Magda Kubecka and Katarzyna Górkiewicz. The series of films was financed by funds from the 3rd edition of the 'Science for People' competition organised by the Centre for Cooperation and Dialogue of the University of Warsaw.
- In meetings with our Norwegian consortium partner NILU, we are working out the details by which we will link the traffic model to the atmospheric models. A fruitful meeting with Gabriela Sousa Santos and Henrik Grythe is behind us.
- We are conducting a pilot study of the main quantitative survey of the CoMobility project. We also decided to conduct an additional study to identify attributes for modelling discrete choices.
- This month, we also met with the team we are working with in the process of inventing and implementing interventions in public spaces. Both teams are entirely focused on action, so you can expect to see the collaboration results in the coming months. Follow the news on our website www.comobility.edu.pl.

- Among our plans for March 2022 are:
 - preparations for the project meeting in March in Warsaw,

- further preparations to carry out interventions in the space around the schools,
- start of field research.
