- The CoMobility team, headed by the 'On-Site' Foundation, organised a big field game for students and teachers from the participating classes to conclude the first year of cooperation. - In June, two very important meetings were held between the CoMobility team and experts from the Norwegian funds and NCBiR. The experts positively evaluated the implementation of the project, supporting the team with suggestions for further development. The CoMobility project was awarded as one of the best-implemented projects funded by the IdeaLab competition. The meetings were attended by representatives of the Applied Research Programme Committee, the Ministry of Funds and Regional Policy, the Royal Norwegian Embassy, the Research Council of Norway, the EEA and Norway, the National Centre for Research and Development and the City of Warsaw. On behalf of the UW, the meetings were attended by Prof. Zygmunt Lalak, UW Vice-Rector for Research, Prof. Gabriela Grotkowska, Dean of WNE UW, Prof. Małgorzata Grajper-Głowacka, Vice-Dean of the Faculty of Sociology of UW, and Prof. Katarzyna Śledziewska, Director of DELab UW.
- June was also intensive in research activities. Marcin Luckner from the PW CoMobility team
 presented the study 'Streaming Detection of Significant Delay Changes in Public Transport
 Systems' (conducted with Przemysław Wrona and Maciej Grzenda) at the International
 Conference on Computational Science (ICCS) 2022 in London. Magdalena Kubecka from the
 'On-Site' Foundation spoke at the World Urban Forum in Katowice with a presentation on 'Streets
 for Children As A Tool for Creating Sustainable Cities.'
